#### CURRENT INITIATIVES

The members of the Board of Directors had two teleconferences and two face-to-face Board meetings this year. Between meetings and teleconferences, the Board does a significant amount of work via email to address the everyday workings of the Association.



#### Membership

Our membership as of March 31, 2005 was 946, down from 1023 in the year prior. We have launched a recruitment campaign named "Twin and Win", where each existing member is asked to recruit just one new member. This would double our membership and increase the voice of critical care nursing across Canada considerably. We continue to explore opportunities to share the vision and goals of CACCN with as many nurses as possible.

#### Communication Boards

We have almost 100 CACCN logoshaped boards located in critical care units across the country. The boards are intended to promote communication and networking, and to build our membership. Up to date information is sent out regarding announcements, deadlines for applications for awards, membership applications and notification of contests. Our 2004 Nursing Week contest, "10 Things I Learned as a Critical Care Nurse" was a great success. A special thanks to the liaisons in each unit for maintaining the boards.

#### Adult Certification

This year the adult Critical Care Exam will have its competencies reviewed. Some of the CACCN members who have sat on the exam writing committee have left this year after many years of service. The **CACCN Board of Directors would** like to thank them for their work. Unfortunately the Privacy of Information Laws did not allow CNA to provide us with a list of members who wrote the exam or recertified in 2004. Every effort has been made through the CACCN Chapters, advertising in **Dvnamics: The** Official Journal of CACCN and through announcements at Dynamics 2004 in Banff, to obtain the names of our members who have achieved this important milestone. The list of members that we have will be published in the summer journal. The CACCN BOD

would like to apologize if the list is not complete. Please inform National Office if your name was not on the list. The names of those who certify and re-certify in 2005 will hopefully be submitted to us in the fall by CNA.

#### **Pediatric Certification**

2004 was the second year for the writing of the Pediatric Critical Care Certification exam. Congratulations to all who have written. Unfortunately, the Privacy of Information Laws has also impacted our ability to publish the names of CACCN members who have attained their certification. The same efforts have been made to acknowledge members who have written the pediatric exam as those who completed the adult exam. Please inform National Office if your name was not on the list. We hope that those who certify and recertify in 2005 will be submitted to us in the fall by CNA.

#### Publications

Dynamics- The Official Journal of the CACCN is the only peer-reviewed critical care journal in Canada. We publish four issues annually, which are distributed to approximately 1000 subscribers. The journal is also listed in three library indexes and we have partnered with EBSCO publishing to list some of our articles on-line.

The summer issue of Dynamics is reserved for publishing abstracts that have been accepted for presentation at our fall conference, also called Dynamics. We continue to receive a lot of positive feedback

- from conference delegates and the membership-at-large who report that this initiative is helpful in keeping them in touch with current and new practices in critical care.
- This year we added a new feature that highlights some of the work of our provincial chapters. Each edition of Dynamics features two or three Chapters and allows nurses from across the country to get a glimpse of Chapter activities that are taking place across Canada. This is an excellent opportunity to continue to strengthen our Chapter Connections.
- The Dynamics Journal continues to host a column offered by the Institute for Safe Medication Practices Canada (ISMP Canada). Together we are providing patient safety information on an ongoing basis. ISMP also posts these articles on their ISMP website, and references the article to our Journal. In addition, they provide a link to the CACCN website. We hope to continue this partnership and appreciate the continued support of ISMP Canada as we work toward the goal of continued improvements in patient safety.
- Paula Price, our Clinical Editor, continues to do an outstanding job in effectively leading the Editorial Review Board, consisting of Debbie Fraser Askin (Manitoba), Janice Beitel (Ontario), Kathleen Graham (Ontario), Martha Mackay (BC),

- Franco Carnevale (PQ) and Judy Rashotte (Ontario). Joy Kramarich (Ontario) recently resigned after several years on the Editorial Review Board and we thank her for all her valuable contributions to our Journal. The Publications Chair for 2004-2005 is Asha Pereira---CACCN Vice President.
- CACCN is extremely fortunate to have the commitment of Pappin Communications of Pembroke, Ontario. Bruce, CB and Heather have continued to provide tremendous support to us.
- We have published our Standards of Critical Care Nursing Practice. These standards would not have been possible without the outstanding work of the previous National Boards, Chapter Presidents and members of CACCN.
- We are in the process of completing our newest Position Statement. We hope to publish our position on Family Presence During Resuscitation in the near future.

#### PARTNERSHIPS

#### Canadian Nurses Association

- The CNA chose to provide networking opportunities to the Associate and Affiliate groups via teleconferencing and CACCN participated in this initiative. It continues to be an avenue by which to share information and learn more about CNA initiatives.
- As an Associate group of the CNA, we provide a copy of our annual report to their Association.
- CACCN was invited to participate in a one-day information session / work group meeting in Ottawa on the issue of wait times. Patricia Hynes was in attendance and the minutes of the meeting are pending.
- The CNA looked into fee structures and dates for the certification exams that may be more conducive to nurses and encourage writing.
- The CACCN were eager to be represented in the venue for the revision of the adult certification exam. Asha Pereira participated in the revision process.

#### World Federation

- Bernice Budz continues to be the CACCN representative for the World Federation of Critical Care Nursing (WFCCN). Bernice is also the Treasurer of the Board.
- The philosophy and mission of the WFCCN is reassuringly similar to that of the CACCN

#### Organ Donation / Transplantation

- Patricia Hynes and Asha Pereira plus members of Chapter executives were invited to participate in an interdisciplinary forum on Non-heart Beating Organ Donation. The goal was to develop a national consensus proposal on how organs might be retrieved in end-of-life situations where neurological determination of death criteria is not established.
- While CACCN was pleased to be invited, concerns were expressed about the lack of critical care nursing representation on the steering committee for this initiative. We are awaiting a response on this issue.

- CACCN maintains contact with colleagues in three other countries, namely, Australia, Britain, and the United States:
